Welcome to the

Neonatal Intensive Care Unit (NICU)

We welcome you as our partners as we provide care and safety for your baby. Please review this information to learn more about our NICU guidelines and resources.

Spending Time With Your Baby

Parents are welcome in the NICU nearly always. However, there are times during the week when the NICU is closed to parents:

- Weekly Care Rounds (Nursery C & D): Mondays from 1 to 2:30 p.m.
- Weekly Care Rounds (Nursery A & B): Wednesdays from 1 to 2:30 p.m.
- Special procedures

Daily Quiet Time (Nursing Shift Change)

- Morning nursing shift change: 7 to 7:30 a.m.
- Evening nursing shift change: 7 to 7:30 p.m.

It is important for Quiet Time to be as uninterrupted as possible so that nurses can provide reports and information to the oncoming nurse. Please ask questions before or after Quiet Time.

- If you wish to hold your baby, please arrive no later than 6:45 a.m./p.m.
- If you must leave during Quiet Time, please re-enter after 7:30 a.m./p.m.

Updates on Your Baby

- Please notify your baby's nurse with the best way to contact you.
- Information about your baby will only be given to a legal parent/legal guardian over the telephone or at the bedside.

Visitors

- Per infection control guidelines, only banded parents are allowed in the NICU at this time.
- Banded parents will be screened daily for signs of illness at the NICU desk prior to entering the unit.
- Banded parents entering must wash their hands, up to their elbows, for at least one minute.

Other Important Information

- Only bottled water is allowed due to infection concerns. Other drinks and food are prohibited.
- Please refrain from using cologne, perfume and scented body lotions due to NICU infants' sensitivities.
- Our NICU is a referral center for infants who need a higher intensive level of care. If your infant was transferred to our unit from another hospital, s/he may be transferred back to their birth hospital if his/her health improves.
- We strive to provide your baby the highest quality of care. If you or a family member has a safety or patient care concern that is not being addressed to your satisfaction, please ask a nurse to assist you in contacting the NICU manager/supervisor.
